
Happy New Year!

## From our President

As we enter into a new year it's appropriate that we reflect on the many accomplishments we have made that brought us to this point. During the past year we took on a massive restructuring of our organizational structure, turning our outdated "boards" into more functional "teams." This reorganization placed the ownership of our programs at the working level of the people and started a better connection with the congregation.

Along with the restructuring of the organizational structure came the realignment of the budget. We attempted to redistribute our funds into a "one account" system, realizing that individual boards shouldn't be the sole owner of their funds. The funds in their accounts really belonged to the entire church and should be managed as such. It wasn't easy to change our thinking on this - we had a hundred fifty years to get into the habit! But to their credit, most of our teams jumped on board and made it happen for the good of the whole church.

We still have work to do though. We must re-write our constitution and by-laws. We had hoped to have this ready for the new year, but in order to do it correctly we will need more time. Our goal is to have the changes made and presented to the congregation by the Spring of this year. Thank you for your patience.

There are so many positive changes that it would be impossible to cover them all in this short letter. Please reach out to the team leaders and ask them how they are doing. They will be providing regular updates throughout the year in our newsletter, so we hope this will enhance our communication.

I look forward to an exciting new year and all it will bring to our church.
